Facts on Acts:

Author:	Doctor Luke, who is a frequent traveling companion of Paul's
Date:	Early 60's before Neronian persecution
Period:	Span of some 30 years—early 30s to early 60s
Recipients:	Theophilus (beloved of God)
Genre:	Historical narrative that focuses on action not doctrine
Key verse:	1:8, You shall be my witnesses

Purpose of Acts:

- *Serves as a sequel to Luke (vol. 2), showing how Jesus' mission continued. *Explains origins / roots of the church and why we look the way we do: elders, deacons, missions, Sundays, Christians, Gentiles, etc.
- *Describes the transitional period between gospels and epistles, showing how the gospel breaks through geographical, social, and racial barriers
- *Offers an apologetic for the church, which is repeatedly attacked but is consistently exonerated by Roman officials and courts
- *Gives us encouragement, knowing the church will progress no matter what.
