God's Expectations in the Workplace Ephesians 6:5-9

Workers should obediently serve as unto the Lord. 6:5-8

- ♦The 3rd couplet is even more controversial now than the 1st one!
- ♦Slavery was an integral part of Rome's economy, and churches were apparently full of them: Col. 3:22, I Cor. 7:2, I Tim. 6:1, Titus 2:9, I Pt. 2:18, Philemon, and consider Jesus' parables.
- ♦Why didn't the NT condemn slavery?
- How to obediently serve:

Negative—not with mere eye service or as men pleasers
Positive—in fear and trembling (5:21,33), sincerity of heart with
good will as to Christ, as Christ's slaves doing His will

- ♦Why to obediently serve:
- As with wives and children a motivation is supplied—a payoff exists, see Col. 3:24, I Pt. 2:19 (good testimony in Titus 2;10).
- ♦What obvious implications are there for us today at our jobs? Consider also 4:28, Gen. 2:15, Acts 20:33-35, Prov. 6:6-8, Col. 3:17,18, I Thess. 4:11,12, II Thess. 3:10-12.

- ♦Why little written to masters in contrast w/husbands & dads?
- ♦Treatment: do the same things =? justice and fairness, Col. 4:1
- ♦Why run things this way? Again see Col. 4:1.
