## A HOUSE DIVIDED

3:20-35

## Confusion of Jesus' family—He is misjudged as being crazy. 20,21

Huge crowds inhibit meal time at "home" (Peter's house, 1:29, 2:1,2). Mark uniquely offers a glimpse of the response of Jesus' family to His hectic ministry. *His family* (NIV, ESV, see v.32) thinks He is mentally unstable, and they come from Nazareth to <u>seize</u> Him. See Jn. 7:3-5.

## Confusion of Scribes—He is misjudged as being possessed. 22-30

□The Scribes (OT Law experts) solve the dilemma of how Jesus does miracles, but w/a greater misjudgment, Matt. 9:34, Jn. 8:41ff., 10:19-21.
□Jesus is slanderously said not to be empowered by the Holy Spirit but by Satan—the demon prince Beelzebub / Beelzebul (II Kgs. 1:2-6).
□Jesus' answer begins with a queston—"How . . . ?

=proverbial saying, showing the absurdity of their view.

= warning that maintaining a slanderous view of the Holy Spirit's work thru Jesus (1:10) dooms one (but Act 6:7).

## Clarification of Jesus' family—they are those doing His will, 31,32

Return to Family conflict. Like the Scribes, Jesus' family tries to hinder His mission, as even Peter will later unwittingly seek to do in 8:31-33. Jesus' answer begins with a queston—"Who . . . ?

=redefinition of God's family (household) based on our response to Jesus. See Matt. 10:34-37 / 10:28ff., Eph.2:19, Jn. 17:23, Phm. 1.
