Parable of four soils spoken to the crowd, 4:1-9

Though Scripture typically identifies two types of people, here we get four types of "spiritual personalities." *Listen / hear* (vs. 3,9) carefully so that you can figure out which portrays your personality.

The purpose of parables, 4:10-13

We will save this for later! Just note for now that the crowd gets no explanation, while the disciples do, as mentioned also in 4:34,35.

Parable of four soils explained to disciples, 4:14-20

- ◆Recall context of mixed responses to Jesus--crowd, family, Pharisees.
- ◆Soil #1 (unbelievers) and #4 (productive believers) are easy to grasp, but #2 and #3 are debated. Some see #2's temporariness and #3's unfruitfulness as indicating they are unbelievers (never saved or were saved but later lost their salvation).
- ♦I'd suggest they both are believers in view of Lk.8:12 and the *joyful receiving of the Word* (4:16), especially in view of Luke's usage of *receive* (Lk. 8:13, 18:17, Acts 11:1, 17:11,12). Plus see I Cor. 3:11ff.
- ◆Personalities you don't want as a label:

 One who caves in to pressure--I Pt. 4:12-14, Rev. 2:10, Matt. 5:10.

 One who cares more for the world--Jn. 2:15. I Tim. 6:27. II Tim. 4:10.
- ◆Aim for soil #4 (amazing yield of fruit), Jn. 15:2ff., Gal. 5:22, Phil. 1:22. Here we see why people are as they are and how we ought to be.
