Now we find out what happened to John the Baptist after 1:14. Note the obvious "sandwich structure" which Mark often uses.

Mission of the Twelve begins: sent by Jesus, 7-13

- [®]Why groups of two? Dt. 19:15, Ecc. 4:9,10, also in Acts 11:30, 13:2.
- Why must they take such meager resources?
- What can they expect and how should they respond?

 Matt. 10:16ff. adds a lengthy and sober warning to the twelve.

Martyrdom of John: implications for Jesus, 14-29

□Again note the confusion about just who Jesus really is!
□Lots of Herods! This is Antipas who sought Jesus, Lk. 9:9, 13:32,33.
□Lots of drama here! How are each of these characters portrayed?
□Who should the key characters here remind us of in I Kgs.?
□What things should we learn from what happens here?

Why is this long digression about John's fate inserted here?

Mission of the Twelve completed: return to Jesus, 30-32 We get specifics for how it went with John but not so with the 12! Again note the great ministry demands (3:20) and a need for R&R.



What should we be fully aware of once we put our faith in Christ, especially if we are determined to speak up?
