Losing All to Gain Christ Philippians 3:1-11

Two commands: be joyful and beware, 3:1-3

- ❖ Joy again pops up, 1:18,25, 2:2,17,18,28,29, 4:4. See Ps. 32:11, 33:1.
- ❖Fatherly Paul suddenly turns fierce, using three harsh ironic titles—dogs, evil workers, mutilators ("Judaizers"--Acts 15:1,5, Gal. 5:6-12, 6:12-16).
- ❖Paul and the Philippians = the true circumcision (Col. 2:11,12). They boast / exalt in the Lord (I Cor. 1:30,31; this idea is from Jer. 9:23,24).

Two kinds of confidence: in the flesh or in Christ, 3:4-11

- This autobiographical sketch (so common for Paul) relates how his own "spiritual overachievements" had to be trashed to truly experience God.
- ❖What confidence in the flesh looks like:

Note listed overachievements that once seemed valuable . . . four = hereditary (Acts 22:2-3, true Jew, and from a favored tribe) three = by choice (in strictest sect, zealous, obeyed to the max)

❖What confidence in Christ looks like:

Note listed aims considered now of surpassing value: counting all as loss for the sake of Christ (*skubala*, Mtt. 13:44-46) knowing Christ (2x), gaining Christ, being found in Him experiencing His resurrection power and suffering (I Pt. 2:21) resurrecting from the dead (1:23, Rom. 6:5)

Questions: In whom is my confidence? I mean, really?

Do I get this loss / gain thing, and is it a reality in my life?
