- ◆Vital worship experiences are best when you have an understanding of order and etiquette (I Cor. 14:33).
 - ... consider others during worship
- ◆ Vital worship experiences are best when you have a variety of instruments and songs (II Chron. 29:25-39, Ps. 150).
 - . . .consider others' tastes
 - . . . consider the need for the new (Ps. 33:3, 40:3)
