  - . . . consider others during worship
- ◆ Vital worship experiences are best when you have a variety of instruments and songs (II Chron. 29:25-29, Ps. 150).
  - . . . consider others' tastes
  - . . . consider the need for the new (Ps. 33:3, 40:3)
