



Now the king of Aram was warring against Israel; and he counseled with his servants . . .



Vitiligo is a skin condition in which there is a loss of brown color (pigment) from areas of skin, resulting in irregular white patches




She said to her mistress, "I wish that my master were with the prophet who is in Samaria! Then he would cure him of his leprosy."

QUESTION:


Why did Naaman struggle so much with this simple command?
