Religious leaders seek how to seize Jesus. 14:1,2

©Sandwich structure again, as in 3:20-35, 5:21-43, 11:12-21 ©A woman is yet again held up as a stellar example for us. ©Repeated intent to kill Jesus--3:6, 11:18, 12:12, Jn. 11:53

A woman attempts to show honor to Jesus. 14:3-9

IWomen anointing Jesus: Lk. 7:36-50, Matt. 26:-13, Jn. 12:1-8.
Only John mentions Mary, who recently saw Jesus heal her brother (ch.11);, and only John records Jesus' foot-washing.
Ilt's a lot of perfume (Jn. 12:3), and it costs a lot! (\$).
IThe 12's frustration / Jesus' correction recall 10:13-16, 35-45.
Could you see yourself responding as the 12?
IJesus' defense of Mary suggests she is more aware of what He will undergo (like a predictive preparation) than the 12!

Judas seeks how to betray Jesus. 14:10-11

Betrayal overjoys the chief priests—they now have a mole.

At least one reason for Judas' betrayal is the money, Jn. 12:6.
