Finding Examples Worth Following Philippians 3:17-21

Paul addressed <u>legalism</u> in 2-11; then he addressed <u>perfectionism</u> and the notion of easing up because of past success in 12-16; and now he nails the issue of <u>antinomianism</u>-and again examples / patterns are key!

Examples we should follow in life, 17

- -Paul = an example: 4:9, I Cor. 4:16,17, 10:32,33, 11:1, II Thess. 3:7-9.
- -Others who = good examples: I Thess. 1:6, I Tim. 4:12, Heb. 6:12, 13:7.
- -Why be scoping out / on the lookout (Rom. 16:17) for good examples?

Examples we should avoid in life, 18,19

- Q: Who are these who make Paul weep and are enemies of the cross?
 - 1) Their end is destruction, II Cor. 11:13-15 (contrast w/3:12)
 - 2) Their god is their belly, Rom. 16:17,18
 - 3) Their glory is their shame, Hos. 4:7
 - 4) Their mindset is worldly, contrast mindset in 2:5, 3:15

This = a warning about believers who are likely self-indulgent itinerants.

Eagerly awaiting our Savior 20,21

- -Two contrasting lifestyles come with two contrasting destinies.
- -Eagerly waiting for Christ's coming: I Cor. 1:7, Heb. 9:28, Rom. 8:19ff.
- -Two highlights of Christ's coming: 1) our physical transformation, 2) subjection of all things to Himself.
- -Compare our *humble* state's future *transformation* (3:21) with 2:6-8. Compare our conforming to His *glory* w/2:9-11. See the implications?
