Saved by His Dying Love Rom. 5:6-11

Christ's death for us demonstrates God's love. 6-8

- *Weak/Ungodly—recalls the ungodly in 1:18.
- *At the right time =Gal. 4:3-5, Dan. 9:24-26,I Pt. 1:20
 - *What's the point of the bad description of people in 6,8,10?
 - *5:8 recall Jn. 3:16. Who is obviously the initiator?
- *How willing would you be to die for someone else, and would it matter whom is was?

Christ's death saves us from the wrath to come. 9

- *Both 9 and 10 present "how-much-more arguments" (as in 15,17) to assure protection from God's wrath; but note this hostility (*enemies*) was on both sides, 1:30,8:7.
- *Saved through His life suggests 8:34, Heb. 7:25, I Jn. 2:1,2.
- *How does justification and reconciliation differ? See reconcile in 7:11, II Cor. 5:17ff., and blood in Col. 1:20, Heb. 9:22.

Christ's reconciliation is reason for exultation. 10,11

Reconciliation with God is another reason for exultation, which recalls exulting in 5:2,3.

MAN'S LOVE

For one will hardly die for a righteous man; though perhaps for the good man someone would dare even to die.

GOD'S LOVE

But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us.
