## *Mercy Means a Remnant and More* Romans 9:25-29

In 9:25-29 Paul concludes his defense against the notion that God's word about Israel has failed (9:6a). Not only must we respect God's sovereign mercy, but God's word has proved to be true about both Jews and Gentiles.

## Once-rejected Gentiles now receive mercy. 9:25-26

<u>Verse 25</u> picks up on God's selection of *vessels of mercy* and appeals to OT predictions for proof that mercy to Gentiles is to be expected.

Hos. 2:23 is actually a prediction of God's restoration of Israel that is analogous to God's merciful reversed response to Gentiles today. We are likewise now loved! Compassion/mercy = beloved

<u>Verse 26</u> (from Hos. 1:9,10) Now we Gentiles can be God's people/sons! I Pt. 2:9,10 also quotes Hosea for our new relationship with God.

Principle: God is a God who is willing to accept those . . .

Only a remnant of Jews receives mercy. 9:27-29

Verse 27,28 = (from Isa. 10:22,23, with some variations)

Isaiah's threatening words to Israel of upcoming attacks and future tribulation will result in only a remnant being saved; thus the present limited Jewish response to the gospel is to be expected.

<u>Verse 29</u> = (from Isa. 1:9) Things could have been so much worse were God not merciful. This remnant also confirms that God's word (9:6a) is being/will be fulfilled (11:5,25-27).

Principle: God need not save all to show mercy; He shows mercy by . . .
