

Walking with God in a Death-filled World **Genesis 5:1-32**

God: the Father of mankind who made us in His image for blessing. 1,2

◆5:1-6:8 gives a brief *history* of Adam's line through Seth. It begins by recalling day six of creation and continues the contrast w/Cain's line.

◆Focus here = God's fatherhood, us as image-bearers, and blessing.

Enoch: the godly exception to dying in a genealogy of death. 21-24

◆Note unique repetition of *and he died* (8x). Why?

◆How could these people have lived for so long? And why not now?

◆Why did God suddenly take Enoch? What is the implication for us?

Lamech: the parent who believed his son, Noah, would bring rest. 28-32

◆Lamech's hope reveals the words of 3:15-19 were passed on.

◆As with Eve (4:1), Lamech isn't correct in his hope—at least not in the way he thought!
